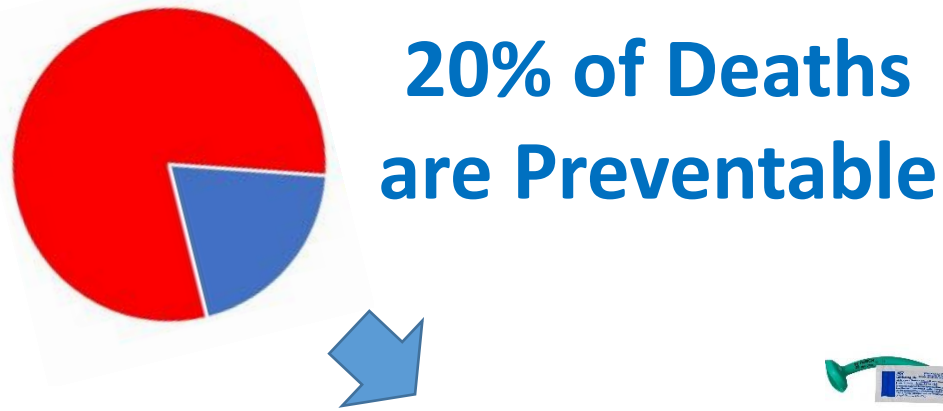

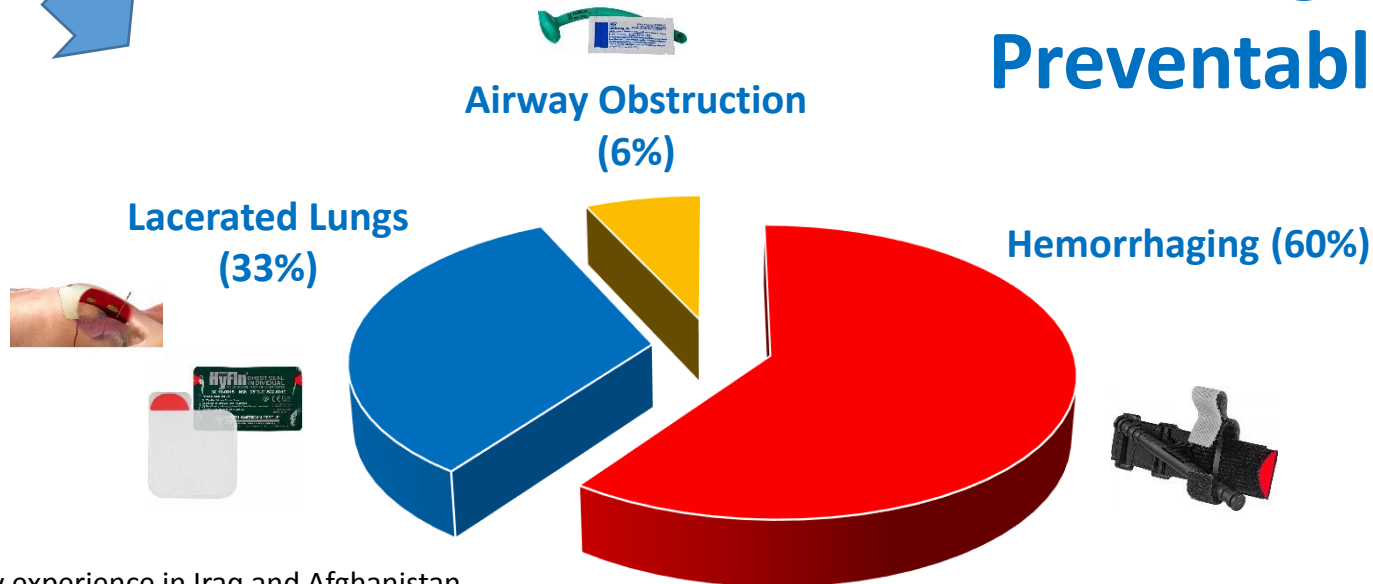

# The Problem: Combat Deaths from Penetrating Trauma

- Aid during first “Golden Hour” is key to survival
- Statistically, we could have saved 19-20 heroes’ lives in first 4 days of April 2016 <sup>(1)</sup>

# Training Infrastructure Functioning, TCCC Guidelines Adopted

---

- Armenia's core medics team completed world-class training led by NATO



- Tactical Combat Casualty Care (TCCC) guidelines already adopted
- 15 “Black-Belts” are certified to “Train the Trainers”
- Professional Army Combat Medic School started operating in October, 2016

# In July 2016 We Shipped 3,000 Combat Casualty Care Kits to Armenia (\$203,000)

# Plans for 2017

---

- There are 10 Border Regions
  - ~1,500 soldiers each
  - ~\$100,000 each Region
- \$70 per soldier
- ~\$600 per Squad



- 20% already deployed (as of December 2016)
- Goal for 2017: cover 50% of entire front line
